Sustaining Ethical Practice:

Identifying and Protecting Against Unconscious Bias in the Therapy Room

The question is not "do we have bias?" but "how much do we have?" When faced with complex situations or too little time or information, unconscious bias helps us make decisions. But bias, influenced by culture, environment, and experience can have unintended consequences like paying men higher salaries than women or giving overweight employees lower job ratings. So, what happens when bias creeps into the therapy room? Through anonymous surveys using participant's smart phones, clinical examples, and interactive exercises, participants will learn the science behind unconscious bias, ethical principles/standards to protect against it, and evidence-based strategies to overcome it.

Learning Objectives:

1. Discuss the science and research of unconscious bias.
2. Explain how unconscious bias can impact critical treatment decisions.
3. Critique your own unconscious bias and at least three ways it can impact your behavior.
4. Identify at least two ethical principles and standards that are intended to protect against the influence of unconscious bias.
5. Apply two evidence-based strategies for reducing unconscious bias and increasing conscious awareness and multiculturally competent practice.

Do No More Harm: Common Ethical Considerations in Trauma Treatment

For persons who have survived the injury of trauma, psychologists work hard to ensure that they are not further harmed by the process of treatment. This workshop will examine ethical dilemmas that commonly arise in the treatment of trauma and review ethical principles and standards that address these challenges. Participants will use an ethical decision-making model to formulate decisions to common ethical dilemmas in trauma treatment based on culturally diverse client cases.

Learning Objectives:

1. Describe three ethical dilemmas that commonly arise in the treatment of trauma.
2. Identify at least two ethical principles that are relevant to common ethical dilemmas found in trauma treatment.
3. Identify at least two ethical standards that are relevant to common ethical dilemmas found in trauma treatment.
4. Summarize one ethical decision-making model.
